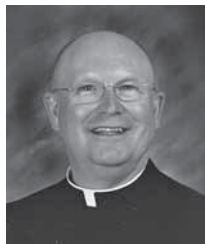

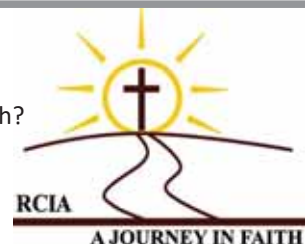


RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS (RCIA)

St. John Chrysostom, bishop and Doctor of the Church



September 13 is the feast day (of Saint John Chrysostom, bishop and Doctor of the Church born in Antioch in 349. An Early Church Father best known for his preaching and public speaking, Saint John was given the name Chrysostomos, meaning "golden mouthed," after death. What set him apart from others in his time period was his ability to apply Sacred Scripture to everyday circumstances, teaching people how to incorporate the Gospel in all that they did. His practical sensibility has given his words an enduring quality, inspiring men and women across the world more than a thousand years after his death.

To give you a sense of his "golden mouth" and ability to apply the Gospel to everyday life, here are some inspiring quotations from Saint John Chrysostom. *His wise advice is still fresh and relevant for us and families today, fifteen hundred years after they were spoken:*

- ◆ No matter how just your words may be, you ruin everything when you speak with anger."
 - ◆ "So let the name of the saints enter our homes through the naming of our children, to train not only the child but the father, when he reflects that he is the father of John or Elijah or James; for, if the name be given with forethought to pay honor to those that have departed, and we grasp at our kinship with the righteous rather than with our forebears, this too will greatly help us and our children. Do not because it is a small thing regard it as small; its purpose is to succor us."
 - ◆ "To destroy the fetus 'is something worse than murder.' The one who does this 'does not take away life that has already been born, but prevents it from being born.'"
 - ◆ "How is it not absurd to send children out to trades, and to school, and to do all you can for these objects, and yet, not to "bring them up in the chastening and admonition of the Lord"?"
 - ◆ "Do not be ashamed to enter again into the Church. Be ashamed when you sin. Do not be ashamed when you repent. Pay attention to what the devil did to you. These are two things: sin and repentance. Sin is a wound; repentance is a medicine. Just as there are for the body wounds and medicines, so for the soul are sins and repentance. However, sin has the shame and repentance possesses the courage."
 - ◆ "The love of husband and wife is the force that welds society together. Men will take up arms and even sacrifice their lives for the sake of this love....when harmony prevails, the children are raised well, the household is kept in order, and neighbors, friends, and relatives praise the result. Great benefits, both of families and states, are thus produced. When it is otherwise, however, everything is thrown into confusion and turned upside-down."
 - ◆ "Even if we have thousands of acts of great virtue to our credit, our confidence in being heard must be based on God's mercy and His love for men. Even if we stand at the very summit of virtue, it is by mercy that we shall be saved."
 - ◆ "But first I want you to tell me this: do you know the power of love? Christ passed over all the marvelous works which were to be performed by the apostles and said, "By this shall men know that ye are my disciples, if ye love one another."
