

In various feasts throughout the year, the Church recites or sings a special "sequence." On Pentecost, the sequence is entitled *Veni, Sancte Spiritus* ("Come, Holy Spirit") and invokes the third Person of the Blessed Trinity, asking for the Spirit to come and refresh our weary hearts.

Pentecost is one of the two times in the year when a Sequence is obligatory, the other being Easter Sunday. Sequences developed out of the practice of the cantor extending the final 'a' of the gospel Alleluia on important celebrations. Gradually, words were added to the melody and by about the year 1000, the texts had been organized into extended rhyming verse. The words focused on the particular feast or mystery being celebrated. These poems were always sung as hymns, never recited. The sequence of Pentecost dates back to at least the 13th century and has been called the "Golden Sequence" because of its exceptional beauty.

While often these sequences can go quickly by during the liturgy, in truth they are prayers, and can be prayed privately as well, opening our hearts to the perhaps most-overlooked Person of the Blessed Trinity, the Holy Spirit.
